<b>Preconditions for participation</b>	Basic knowledge of crisis settings in public health			
<b>Teaching Methods</b>	The course uses participatory learning based on lectures (30 %), individual reading (10%), individual exercise (10%) plenary and group discussions (15%), facilitated group work and presentations (30%) and peer –feedback (5%).			
<b>Lesson format (online/face-to-face)</b>	face-to-face			
<b>Assessment method</b>	<p>Final examination using short essay questions and multiple choice based on the learning objectives (70%, individual mark) and group work presentation on selected topics (30%, group mark); passing mark is 60% for both parts together combined.</p> <p>Participants have the chance to re-sit the written exam not later than 4 weeks after announcement of results.</p> <p>If the student fails to reach the passing grade of 60 %, s/he will be able to re-sit an oral exam not later than 2 weeks after receiving coordinator’s comments.</p>
